## Steps to answering individual 7<sup>th</sup> chord questions

- 1. Study the question. Write the note given on the staff.
- 2. Write the three (7th chord) notes above this to create a chord. It is not necessary to add the note of the upper octave.
- 3. Add in the required accidentals (do not omit this step) using either your knowledge of key or intervals within chords.
- 4. Check your answer preferably by singing (inner hearing of course) the solfa.

### Steps to answering diatonic 7<sup>th</sup> chord questions

- 1. Study the question. Using your knowledge of tonal names work out the note each chord is based on. Write this note given on the staff.
- 2. Write the three (7th chord) notes above this to create a chord.
- 3. Add in the required accidentals (do not omit this step) preferably using your knowledge of key (or intervals within chords).
- 4. Write the name of the chord you have created on the appropriate line below.
- 5. Check your answer preferably by singing (inner hearing of course) the solfa.
