Click on this video icon to learn about letter names.


Notes have letter names that use the first seven letters of the alphabet: A to G.

Here are the notes learned so far:



- When we write **solfa names** we use **lower case** letters.
- When we write **letter names** we use **UPPER CASE** (capital) letters.
- To learn to read solfa and letter names fluently, it is important that you **don't** write the solfa or letter names of all the notes beneath the music. If they are already there, or you are required to write them in, cover what you have written before reading the notes looking at the staff.


